WELCOMING NEW PROGRAMS AT HOCKING COLLEGE

 \mathbf{T} his month, Hocking College gained three new accreditations from the Higher Learning Commission for new Associates Degree programs, and will begin accepting new students immediately. These new programs have been in progress establishing curriculum and customizing learning outcomes, and are now officially accredited and accepting students for a 2-year degree track.


With the programs being HLC approved, this means that students can now utilize federal financial aid to help pay for their degrees. Hocking College also has other scholarships available. The three new programs are Sports Management, Theatre and Social Work.

The Associate of Applied Science in Sports Management degree prepares students for a variety of careers in the sport and athletic industry including sports business, sports administration, sports marketing, sports communication, sports facilities management, and sports entertainment.

The Associate of Arts in Theatre degree at Hocking College is committed to providing students with extensive practical and professional knowledge pertinent and responsive to the dynamic fields of employment in all areas of theatre. The faculty provide students with sufficient depth and hands-on experience to allow those interested in both live performance and theatre technology to engage in complex problem solving, physical and verbal communication, project management, and leadership through coursework and experiences in theatre arts.

The Associate of Arts in Social Work degree is designed to prepare students to enter the workforce in the mental health arena working with adults, teens, children and families in the areas of clinical mental health and substance abuse treatment. Students receive hands-on experience in the field to gain a better understanding of the mental health community and where they see themselves going once they graduate.

Hocking College is committed to providing exceptional education to students in all fields, and continues to grow its course and program offerings to meet the needs of the workforce. Hocking College hopes to offer another round of new Associates Degree programs and Short-Term Certificate programs by Autumn 2022, with a specific focus on current and future job market needs.

Early Childhood Teacher Education Gets New Program Manager

Paige McClain Ph.D. is the new Program Manager for Hocking College's Early Childhood Teacher Education program.

Born and raised in Albany, OH., Dr. McClain attended Alexander High School. Then she studied at Ohio University where she earned a bachelor of arts in psychology with a minor in sociology. She later received a master of education in special education, followed by a doctor of philosophy in curriculum and instruction in 2021.

Dr. McClain's classroom teaching experience includes everything from an after-school elementary tutor position for AMICUS Learning Centers in Cincinnati, OH, to being a school-age camp lead teacher for Stages Early Learning Center in Athens, OH.

In addition to Dr. McClain's work in the classroom, she has also contributed to articles that have appeared in prestigious publications such as the Peabody Journal of Education and Action in Teacher Education, and worked on a variety of research projects while at Ohio University.

Dr. McClain's diverse background includes doing national presentations on subjects such as clinical models for educational partnerships and partner schools, and how clinically-based field research can impact learning outcomes and school culture.

One unique distinction that she feels will help her connect with her students: she's a first-generation college student. She specified that, "being a first gen has its own set of challenges, especially with figuring out the logistics of how college works and all of the moving parts that goes along with the many processes that happen."

Dr. McClain added that, "Because I was in that situation, I feel as though I will be able to relate to my students and potentially provide a mentoring role to my students, and support them in other ways aside from just succeeding in their courses."

Hocking College's Early Childhood Education program prepares students to become licensed and secure employment in the early childhood industry. In addition, this program provides students with the academic foundation they'll need to pursue a bachelor's degree.

Smaller class sizes allow students to get more one-on-one time with their instructors as they cover the following core subjects:

Instructional strategies Academic skills General education & special education Classroom management Application of technology in the classroom.

Students who graduate from this program with an Associate of Applied Science in Early Childhood Education can expect the following outcomes:

Ability to effectively teach pre-kindergarten through third grade Ability to assist in multiple educational environments Effective classroom management skills How to assist children with disabilities How to uphold federal, district and agency policies and procedures

TAILORED TO CAREERS

FASHION DESIGN & RETAIL MERCHANDISING

Hocking College's Fashion Design & Retail Merchandising program started in Autumn 2020, providing students with a unique 2-year pathway geared to help them successfully enter the fashion & retail markets. Since its beginning, the program has grown to include additional faculty, advanced sewing and learning labs, and a new entrepreneurial venture.

Program Manager Coral Wedel tailors the curriculum to provide students with real-world and hands-on practical experience. Wedel comes to Hocking College from a background in Fashion Design, business, and education. She discovered her love of fashion as a child, inspired by the idea that fashion is a means of self-expression. Her first unofficial collection consisted of costumes she created to convey her unique sense of style and individuality. Eager to make her mark in the fashion industry, Wedel pursued a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from the School of Art Institute in Chicago. After graduating in 2005, she embraced opportunities to work in design, production and sales for both women's and children's wear.

Wedel had the good fortune to become a student of designer Geoffrey Mac. In addition to winning season 18 of Project Runway, the long-running reality T.V. show that focuses on fashion design, Mac is also a streetwear and jewelry designer. Wedel admires Mac for his technical aptitude and enjoyed following his journey on the show. In turn, Mac considers Wedel "one of [his] favorite students of all time". "She has a vast knowledge of all things fashion", Mac says. "[She] has skills across-the-board in everything from design to pattern making".

Wedel began her career in the fashion industry in Los Angeles and went on to a seasonal teaching position at Nova Scotia College of Art & Design University (NSCAD University). Then, in 2009 Wedel became a mother — an event that prompted her return to her Appalachian roots. These life shifts were the genesis for the creation of her namesake small business, Coral Marie. Located in the countryside near Albany OH, Wedel describes Coral Marie as "a sustainable slow fashion collection and custom clothier". "Sustainable fashion requires accountability and transparency of its impact for good in the areas of social, purpose, planet, and profit", she explained.

Last Spring, Wedel took part in a conference that focused on topics related to the fashion industry, spearheaded by the Columbus Fashion Council (CFC). This conference involved 30 fashion industry experts and hosts from the Council of Fashion Designers of America who shared their insights on topics ranging from trade shows, the modeling industry, and diversity in the fashion industry. The goal of this premier conference was to give industry experts the opportunity to connect and show support for designers, educators, entrepreneurs and retail professionals stationed in Ohio. Wedel spoke on the panel titled "Sustainable Fashion: How to Adapt", which addressed the impact that an ecological focus can have on the fashion community. Wedel was able to share the live-stream of the conference to her classroom at Hocking College, providing students the unique opportunity to learn from this professional panel.

The Fashion Design & Retail Merchandising program started Autumn Semester 2021 with 3 new program faculty: Melissa Miller, Jinhwa Lee, and Hollie Priah. With backgrounds ranging from business to technical sewing, these new faculty are all committed to educating and inspiring their students through hands-on learning and critical thinking alongside Coral Wedel.

In September 2021, in celebration of National Sewing Month, the Fashion Design & Retail Merchandising program at Hocking College launched a new entrepreneurial venture, HC Alterations. It offers alterations and mending services free to Hocking College students and at a low cost to the community. Throughout this past summer, the college's first class of Fashion Design & Retail Merchandising students and faculty began a pilot program for a mending and alterations service. They offered hemming, button replacing, and more to

Hocking College Summer staff to fine-tune their offerings and gain experience in the services they would be offering in the new venture.

Some of the services offered include:


Hemming (Pants, Skirts, and Shirts) Waist Resizing (Pants & Skirts) Button Replacing Patching Basic Mending Ironing & Steaming

By working in partnership with the Career Closet in the Career & University Center at Hocking College, the program hopes to help provide students with access to well-fitting professional attire for interviews or events free of charge.



The program also offers consultations on custom projects for more advanced alteration or mending needs. With the HC Alterations venture and supervision from their instructors, students in the Fashion Design & Retail Merchandising program will gain experience with the skills and tools needed to succeed in their industry after graduation, and will be ready to work in the competitive fields of both fashion and retail.

STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

Coral Wedel, Program Manager for Fashion Design & Retail Merchandising, says the ideal candidate for her program is "any student interested in making this exciting subject matter their area of profession that is also self-motivated and willing to learn". One such example of this student is currently-enrolled Jazmin Cruz.

Over the summer of 2021, the pilot program for the new HC Alterations endeavor was spearheaded by student Cruz, whose goal was to help her fellow students look as professional as possible when they enter the job market. Cruz knew that Hocking College has a Career Closet where students can borrow professional attire for interviews and events at no cost, but she identified an opportunity for improvement when she realized that having access to professional clothing is only the first step to looking the part — the second step was proper fitting.

Cruz got to work learning basic mending and alterations skills with the supervision of Program Manager Coral Wedel, and began offering the pilot version of the HC Alterations venture to Hocking College staff. She replaced buttons, mended seams, and hemmed pant legs until she was confident enough to move on to more advanced skills. Now, HC Alterations offers a variety of services, and even welcomes custom projects on a case-by case basis. Furthermore, all of the Hocking College Fashion Design & Retail Merchandising students will be involved in bringing HC Alterations to fruition, thanks to Cruz's initiative and peer leadership.

When asked about her academic experience at Hocking College, Cruz said: "I came to this program not knowing much about sewing and fashion in general. After several weeks of classes I have gained knowledge and skills that left me feeling confident and excited to learn more!" She added that "this program here at Hocking gave me the opportunity to sew and learn about fabrics and how clothes are constructed which is very interesting to me".

Wedel describes Cruz as a "very capable as a seamstress". In regard to her progress in the program, Wedel said that "Jazmin has grown so much this last year as a student through her courses, but more importantly through her own initiative to conquer challenges and her eagerness to learn". Cruz hopes to one day teach others and share her skills with a new generation of fashion design students.

CIRCLEVILLE PUMPKIN SHOW

CIRCLEVILLE OHIO'S ANNUAL PUMPKIN SHOW SCHEDULED FOR OCTOBER 20-23, 2021.

The Circleville Pumpkin Show is Ohio's oldest and largest festival, getting its start in 1903 when the Mayor of Circleville hosted a pumpkin and corn exhibit in front of his store. Champion pumpkins are delivered from around the area to compete for "largest pumpkin" at the show, and a wide variety of pumpkin foods, games, and events have grown out of this annual event.

The Circleville Pumpkin show begins on the third Wednesday of October each year, with this year's event beginning on October 20th, 2021. This will be the 114th Circleville Pumpkin Show, and will once again be free to the public. Some of the activities that the Pumpkin Show hosts are a pie eating contest, hog calling, arts and crafts, musical performances, and seven different parades.

2021 TRICK-OR-TREAT IN SOUTHEAST OHIO

Although some cities and communities have not yet announced if or when they will be holding their Trick-or-Treat nights for 2021 Halloween, Nelsonville has designated Saturday, October 30th from 5:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. for its local Beggar's Night. The city of Nelsonville has also released guidelines to maintain safety while out trick-or-treating, including:

HOCKING MAKERS MARKET BLOOMS

NEW EVENT CONNECTING AREA ARTISANS WITH THE LOCAL COMMUNITY EXPECTS GROWTH IN COMING MONTHS

In September 2021, The Hocking Makers Network launched its first Makers Market to support area artists, craftspeople and vendors in connecting to the local community to make sales and establish relationships.

The Hocking Makers Network is a venture of Hocking College in partnership with the School of Workforce Development. The Makers Network includes three maker spaces which host community events and educational

opportunities for both Hocking College students as well as the greater public. The Hocking Makers Network uses its mission statement to guide new endeavors and practices:

The Hocking Makers Network is devoted to empowering people to find their passions through introduction to tools; approachable, affordable classes; and workshop

membership opportunities to pursue their interests on their own. Pipelines to (1) workforce development, (2) higher education, (3) entrepreneurial endeavors, or (4) avenues to explore new hobbies all contribute to the value that the HMN provides to Nelsonville and surrounding communities.

They hope to expose people to skills, careers, and potential passions they didn't know they had, and to establish a network of workshops, tools, resources, classes, connections and opportunities to the local community.

With the goal of community engagement in mind, the Hocking Makers Network began developing a monthly gathering for artists and vendors, and they call it the Makers Market. The first monthly Hocking Makers Market event was held on September 4, and is scheduled to occur on the first Saturday of each month moving forward. Some of the vendors who participated were:

MEN'S AND WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY COMPETE IN FIRST-EVER MEET AT THE CHARLESTON GOLDEN EAGLE INVITATIONAL

The men's and women's cross country program traveled to the first meet in Hocking College history Friday, September 3rd as the Hawks ran in the University of Charleston Golden Eagle Invitational. The team brought six runners in total with five scoring men, allowing them to score as a team. The men raced 6,000 meters and the women raced 4,000 meters.

Freshman Moss Loebker-

Conrad led the Hawks with a 55th place finish in a time of 25:36. Freshman Dax Austin was not far behind in 58th place (26:00). Rounding out the scoring for the men was sophomore Marcus Perko (60th / 27:08), freshman Tyrus Wilkins (62nd / 31:17), and freshman Carter Amole

(63rd / 32:31). The men's team placed 5th with a score of 155 points.

The women's team had one finisher in the 4K, sophomore Maria Perez (46th / 23:45).

Hocking's men and women will race again on Friday, September 17th at the All-Ohio Championships in Cedarville, OH.

The Hocking College Hawks welcomed the Sussex County Community College Skylanders to Boston Field for the first home game of the 2021 season Saturday September 11, 2021. The Hawks jumped out to an early lead and never looked back, bringing home the win 38-2.

Hocking was led on offense by quarterback Ditannon Otis, as he connected on 10 of 17 attempts for 229 yards and 2 touchdowns. His leading receiver was Brayden O'Dell who snagged 4 catches for 108 yards and a touchdown, his longest on a 90 yard strike early in the 2nd quarter. The Hawks offensively finished with 272 total yards in the game.

KICKING IT WITH CADEN

HOCKING COLLEGE STUDENT ATHLETE MAKES HISTORY

Caden Cox is a freshman at Hocking College, pursuing an Associate of Technical Study degree with a focus on Canine Programs and Performing Arts. He is a kicker on the Hocking College Hawks Football team, a member of the Theater club, and a student employee on campus.

On September 11 2021, Hocking College Hawks football played against Sussex Community College at their first home game in Nelsonville, Ohio. In that game, Caden Cox was the first individual with Down syndrome to play in an NCAA or NJCAA college football game. He also became the first player born with Down syndrome to score a point in a NCAA or NJCAA college football game when he scored the 35th point with an Extra Point kick after a Hawks touchdown.

Cox has been playing varsity football since High School, where he played as a kicker following in his older brother's footsteps. He attended Freemont Ross High School where he was awarded "Player of the Game" during his Senior Homecoming game. His older brother Zane Cox was also a kicker who played in Hocking College's inaugural football team in 2015 and now coaches Division 1 Football.

Caden Cox is also the first student athlete at Hocking College to enter into a Name, Image, & Likeness contract with a local business. Starting in July 2021, the NCAA and NJCAA allowed student athletes across the nation to begin entering into Name, Image & Likeness contracts with private businesses for the first time in College Athletics history. This new policy allows student athletes to receive financial compensation or sponsored products from private companies by entering into contracts in accordance with state & local laws and individual college policies. Hocking College quickly began writing a new policy for its student athletes in regards to the new procedures, establishing guidelines for NIL contracts between local businesses and Hocking College NJCAA athletes. In September 2021, Cox entered into a contract with Rocky Brands.

At the same home game on September 11, the halftime


